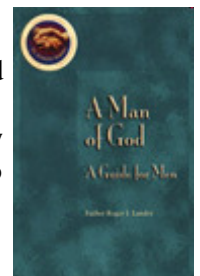


Faith Enrichment Series

The Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The above is shown on Catholic Calendars for September 12th. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists the following as titles given to Mary. Advocate, Help, Benefactress, Mediatrix, Assumed into Heaven, Ever Virgin, Full of Grace, Handmaid of the Lord, Immaculate, Mother of Christ, Mother of the Church, Mother of God, Mother of the living, The New Eve, All Holy, Seat of Wisdom.

Paragraph 2146 of the Catechism states, “The second commandment forbids the abuse of God’s name, i.e. every improper use of the names of God, Jesus Christ, but also of the Virgin Mary and all the saints.”

Paragraph 963: “Since the Virgin Mary’s role in the mystery of Christ and the Spirit has been treated, it is fitting now to consider her place in the mystery of the Church. The Virgin Mary... is acknowledged and honored as being truly the Mother of God and of the Redeemer... She is clearly the mother of the members of Christ... since she has by her charity joined in bringing about the birth of believers in the Church, who are members of its head. Mary, Mother of Christ, Mother of the Church”.

Paragraph 975: “We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the Church, Continues in heaven to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ”.

Holy Father’s Prayer Intentions—September

General:

That the Word of God may be better known, welcomed and lived as the source of freedom and joy.

Mission:

That Christians in Laos, Cambodia, and Myanmar, who often meet with great difficulties, may not be discouraged from announcing the Gospel to their brothers, trusting in the strength of the Holy Spirit.
